You will be scheduled a time to talk via telephone with a Counseling and Consultation Services (CCS) clinician. When you call, mention you are in CFAES and ask about scheduling ongoing appointments with David Wirt or A. Schaad.

Services through CCS are provided at no charge to all students enrolled at Ohio State. Additionally, dependents of those students covered by the Ohio State Student Health Insurance Plan are eligible to be seen through CCS.
